Public Information/Phoneline Training

What is **Public Information**? PI is informing the public about recovery from addiction through the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions of NA. The purpose of a public information subcommittee is to inform the public that NA exists and offers recovery from the disease of addiction. PI work is accomplished through service committees directly responsible to those they serve. These PI subcommittees provide community awareness of what NA is, as well as how, when, and where we are available.

What are **Phoneline** volunteers responsibilities? Volunteers are required to take a phoneline training every two years. We are looking for volunteers willing to share their experiences.

Concepts Learning Day

(History, Application & Principles of the 12 Concepts)

Narcotics Anonymous, as a fellowship, is defined by its principles. Our Twelve Steps detail our program for personal recovery. Our Twelve Traditions relate experience that can help NA groups maintain their unity. And our Twelve Concepts are guiding principles for our service structure. The concepts summarize the hard-won experience of our fellowship’s first forty years with such things as responsibility, authority, delegation, leadership, accountability, spiritual guidance, participation, communication, open-mindedness, fairness, and finances. The Twelve Concepts, together, help ensure that our fellowship’s service structure remains forever devoted to *service, not government*.

The NA Group

NA groups are local, informal associations of recovering addicts. They are the foundation of the NA service structure. Groups are formed for the primary purpose of carrying the NA message of recovery, and all their activities should reflect that purpose. Conducting Narcotics Anonymous meetings is the primary activity of an NA group. The group may conduct its own affairs in whatever way seems fit to its members, provided the group’s actions are consistent with NA’s Twelve Traditions, and do not adversely affect other groups or the entire NA Fellowship. In the conduct of the affairs of NA as a whole, the groups delegate to the rest of the service structure the responsibility for the fulfillment of NA services. Group service representatives (GSRs) are elected to participate on behalf of the groups in the area committee and the regional assembly.

The Area Service Committee (ASC)

The area committee is the primary means by which the services of a local NA community are administered. The area committee is composed of group service representatives, administrative officers (chairperson, vice chairperson, secretary, treasurer), subcommittee chairpersons, and the area’s regional committee members.

The area committee elects its own officers, subcommittee chairpersons, and RCMs.

The ASC Subcommittees

Hospitals and Institutions subcommittees conduct panels that carry the NA message to addicts who often have no other way of hearing our message.

The general mission of your area **public information** subcommittee is to inform addicts and others in the community of the availability of recovery in Narcotics Anonymous.

The **phoneline** subcommittee maintains a telephone information service for Narcotics Anonymous that helps addicts and others in the community find us easily and quickly.

The **literature** supply subcommittee maintains a stock of NA books and pamphlets that can be purchased by local groups at the monthly ASC meeting Dances, picnics, campouts, special speaker meetings—these events are put on by area **activities** subcommittees.
